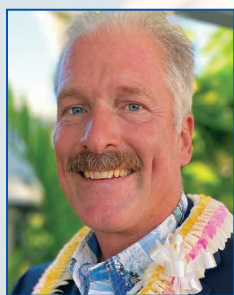

## Commodore's Comments

Greetings Fellow Club Members!

Last month, we held our annual King Kamehameha Regatta on June 14, 2026. Over a dozen boats

sailed out and waited to start the regatta. Over the next few hours, the wind, which was extremely light, began to clock around the compass. The fleet bobbed about, waiting for the wind to settle into one general direction and strengthen to more than 5 knots. Yet the postponement flag—"the Cat in the Hat flag"—dangled limply.

James Ramsey, our Rear Commodore for Sail, headed up the race committee. He and his energetic crew set and reset the marks repeatedly to keep the course properly aligned. Even with all their great effort, the wind just did not want to cooperate. Finally, the word came over the radio: "Race cancelled." Immediately, boat crews responded that they would help retrieve the race marks while the committee boat pulled up its own anchor. The boats doused their sails and gunned their engines to get to the marks first. Sailing vessels *Calispera* and *Galatea* reached the marks first and pulled them up, bringing them back to the harbor. It was a really nice example of spontaneous volunteerism—yacht club members helping each other out. Once back at the Club, the race crews were treated to a delicious lunch prepared by our interim executive chef, Bella, and cold

beer, which hit the spot after bobbing on the waves in the hot summer sun.

On the Adult Dinghy Sailing Program side of the Club, Zest dinghies competed for the first time in the Tuesday night regatta alongside the Cal 20s. Brantly Baynes headed up the Zest fleet to see if they could keep up with the Cal 20s. The Zests started 10 minutes before the Cal 20s and were able to stay ahead of our stout little Cal 20s. It was a successful test, and we will be seeing more of the Zests out on the racecourse on Tuesdays!

Finally, I wanted to update you on our progress in building our J/7 fleet. The J/7 is purpose-built to serve as both an exceptional club boat and a training vessel. Many yacht clubs on the mainland are building their fleets of J/7s. The Waikiki Yacht Club Education Foundation has received funds from three generous donors to purchase the first four boats. For a limited time, WYC holds an option to purchase two more boats. Staff Commodore Dan Weyant is heading up a fundraising campaign for Boat #5. At the time of this writing, a dozen former commodores have signed on to donate, covering half the cost of J/7 #5. More to come on our fundraising efforts. One-design keelboat racing has been the lifeblood of our Club since its founding. Our Club has had many different one-design fleets over the years. Up to World War II, and for some time afterward, the Star boats were the dominant one-design class in Hawai'i and at the new WYC. In addition, we have had the S Class, the 110 and 120 Classes, the Mercury Class, the PC Class, P-Cats, the J/24 Class, the Soling Class, the Melges 24 Class, the Etchells Class, and now, once again, the Cal 20 Class.

The WYC Cal 20 One-Design Fleet was re-started in 2014 by then-Commodore Greg Dunn, with the help of the Board and the Waikiki Yacht Club Education
